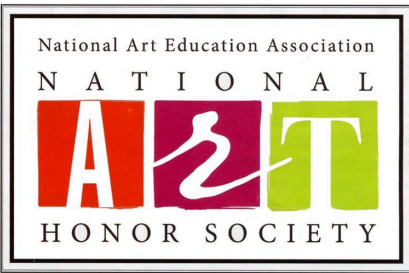

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NAHS | BYLAWS

Members who have the honor of being selected are special representatives of Randolph High School at the highest level of achievement and recognition.

Purpose of chapter:

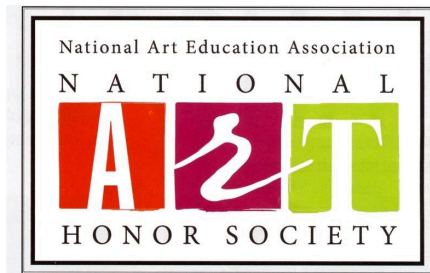
- A. Inspire and recognize those students who have shown outstanding ability in art;
- B. Foster excellence and a dedicated spirit to the pursuit of art;
- C. Further creative and leadership abilities of the Society's members;
- D. Aid members in working toward the attainment of their highest potential;
- E. Bring artistic endeavors to the attention of the school and community;
- F. Participate and engage in artistic events in school and out of school.
- G. Further aesthetic awareness in all aspects of the school's total program.

Membership:

- A. Membership is based on art scholarship, service, and character.
- B. All Sophomores and Juniors are eligible to apply.
- C. All applicants must have a 3.0 GPA, be enrolled in an Art class for next year, and plan to continue taking art classes throughout their senior year.

Section 1. Bylaws must be consistent with the regulations outlined in the constitution of the National Chapter.

Section 2. To remain a member in good standing, a member must:



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- Pay dues
- Earn a minimum of **30** chapter points per year.
- Attend meetings
- Be enrolled in a Visual Arts class at RHS throughout student career

Section 3. Dues are submitted upon acceptance. \$40 is collected from each new member.

Section 4. Attendance is required at meetings to remain active as a member.

Regular meetings are Bi-Monthly during lunch. Special project meetings occur when necessary and are planned in advance.

Absence from school is the only excused absence from NAHS meetings.

Sports and other activities may prevent members from earning chapter points. Special arrangements will be required to reach member goal.

Section 5. All members will participate in NAHS school projects. Independent projects are scheduled and conducted by members individually.

Section 6. Members must retain a 3.0 GPA to remain active.

Section 7. In the event of an infraction of the bylaws, a review by the leadership and advisor is required. If the individual is an officer, they will not participate in the process.

If retained, adjustments will be made to the member's requirements.
